2024 ADVENTURE CAMP AND TEEN EXTREME

We are thrilled to introduce you to our weekly summer day camp programs. Our aim is to provide a safe and enjoyable environment for all our campers. During our camps, we encourage children to learn new skills, engage in fun activities, swim, make friends, and develop their confidence and independence. Our programs help children unplug from technology and explore the world around them. We believe that our campers become more resilient and self-reliant as they participate in our programs.

Camper Information

All enrolled campers must provide a completed <u>camper form</u> by June 1st..

Safety

During camp hours, our staff will be responsible for keeping the following areas safe and secure. Areas included for our use are the Cape Care playground, tennis courts, Capano, & Moulton Field, Multipurpose field, Pond Cove & Middle School area/fields, community center, and pool. Campers are limited to these areas and are not permitted in any space without their counselor. Campers who breach these boundaries will be disciplined according to our Rules & Disciplinary Policy (outlined below).

Schedules

Adventure Camp Daily Schedule (Grades 1-6)

7:15 am to 8:30 am Before Camp Care (pre-registration required). Drop-off at the Cape Care entrance at the community center.

8:30 am Drop Off - Drive through Pond Cove Circle and proceed to the Middle School parking lot (near the baseball field).

8:45 am to 10:15 am Activities - Outdoor games, gym games, arts & crafts, & swim lessons.

10:15 am to 10:30 am Snack - Bring snack or purchase items like chips, cookies, gatorade etc.

10:30 am to 12:00 pm Activities - More outdoor games, gym games, arts & crafts, & swim lessons. Adventure Campers will have swimming lessons 1 - 2 times /week, and a choice to free swim in the afternoons.

12:00 pm to 12:30 pm Lunch - Campers must pack a lunch from home and bring a water bottle.

12:30 pm to 2:45 pm Choice Time - Campers will choose from a variety of activities.

3:00 pm Dismissal Drive through Pond Cove Circle and proceed to the Middle School parking lot (near the Baseball field).

3:00 pm to 5:30 pm After Camp Care (pre-registration required) - Pick up at the Cape Care Playground (before 4:00 pm) or at the Community Center (after 400 pm)

Please let us know if your camper will be attending an after camp activity.

Teen Extreme Camp Daily Schedule (Grades 7-8)

On Tuesdays campers will remain on campus for sports, arts & crafts and swim activities. On Wednesdays they will go on a field trip days to various locations in Maine and New Hampshire. Schedules will be posted in the weekly letter with more specific information. On Thursdays Teen Extreme will join the Adventure Camp on field trips.

Before & After Camp Care

7:15 am Drop off at the Community Center side door (near IGA) 3:00-5:30 pm Pick up at either the Cape Care Playground or the community center

Dismissal Order: Adventure Camp and Teen Extreme

- 1. Adventure Campers attending After Camp Care will be walked to the Cape Care playground (by the High School)
- 2. Kids walking or riding bikes will be dismissed
- 3. Parent pick up

Field Trips & Theme Day

Staff, counselors, and campers all participate in theme days! They are what makes camp special -they encourage camp spirit, generate excitement, and offer campers something to look forward to.

- Thursdays are field trip days for Adventure Camp, please let us know if your child will not be attending camp.
- Campers will receive a camp t-shirt and must be worn on all field trip days. If you do not wear your camp shirt on a field trip day you will be charged \$20 for an additional shirt.

Communication

Weekly emails will be sent out on Fridays before the week of camp with information relating to the upcoming week including field trip details and theme days.

Medication

An Authorization to Dispense Prescription & Non-Prescription <u>Medication Form</u> must be completed, printed, and provided to the camp desk for us to administer to your child during camp hours. Medications must be clearly labeled in their original container and provided to us in a ziplock bag with the Medication Form.

Emergency Procedures

Staff and counselors are CPR certified and equipped with a first aid kit to treat any minor accident. Parents will be contacted immediately if a doctor's attention is required. If immediate medical care is necessary, an ambulance will be called first and then the parents. If the parents are unable to accompany the child to the nearest emergency room, they will be accompanied by a staff person.

Late Fees

Pick-up from camp is promptly at 3:00 pm. Please call us if you know you are running more than 10 minutes late. At 3:15 pm a late fee of \$25 will be charged.

Snack Bar

We will have a snack bar this summer with chips, drinks, and small snacks available for purchase. Campers will be allowed to visit the snack bar during lunch to purchase items. This is optional.

Camper Checklist-

This is what your camper will need for camp each day.

- Water bottle, campers can refill it throughout the day at a watering station. No glass bottles. Please label it with your child's name.
- Backpack, bag, or sac pack to keep all your stuff in. Check lost and found frequently. You may not even realize it's lost until it's found. Labeling all your Child's stuff helps.
- Sunscreen (apply before camp). Counselors will remind your child to re-apply. Please provide sunscreen, protective gear ie. a hat, sunglasses, chapstick, etc. also a good idea.
- Closed-toed shoes are preferably sneakers. We do a lot of running and sports. This helps prevent toe injuries.
- A morning snack, lunch, and drink packed in an insulated cooler with an ice pack. Your camper is going to be busy all day and get hungry so pack a lot of good healthy food.
- Bathing suit & towel and a plastic bag to store when wet. One-piece bathing suits (tankinis covering waist) girls. Shoulder-length hair should be tied back or covered with a swim cap. Goggles are fun and optional. Don't forget to take your wet stuff out when you get home and let it dry for tomorrow.
- Extra change of clothing just in case. Keep them dry in a plastic bag.
- Appropriate clothing. No skirts or 'short' shorts. Cover your shoulders and your bellies. You will be active and outside unless it's pouring rain or a real scorcher. You will get dirty and possibly wet.
- Adventure Campers should leave all of their electronics at home and stuffed animals/toys. This will avoid tears if the item gets lost or broken.
- Teen Extreme campers will be allowed to have cell phones with limited use during snack times and lunch.
- Teen Extreme Campers will be on campus on Tuesdays. Wednesdays and Thursdays are scheduled field trip days. Some field trips will not return until 5:00 pm on Wednesdays, so please be sure to read the weekly email closely. All field trips are weather permitting.
- Last but not least, a positive attitude and lots of energy.

Rules & Disciplinary Policy

Please read and review with your child before attending camp.

RESPECT - Treat yourself, fellow campers, counselors, staff, equipment, supplies, facilities, property and personal belongings with respect. We will not tolerate inappropriate language, behavior, or disrespect.

COMMUNICATION - To ensure your safety and the safety of others, listen carefully to staff and counselor directions, remain with your group at all times, and seek permission to leave your group at any time and for any reason.

RESPONSIBILITY - Campers are expected to conduct themselves in a well-behaved manner. The use of inappropriate language, or possession of a dangerous object, weapon, or illegal substance will not be tolerated and should be immediately reported to the counselor or staff. Offenses include: endangering another person's well-being, swearing or verbal abuse, leaving campus boundaries, stealing or destruction of property, possession or under the influence of an illegal substance.

Stealing, Property Destruction, and Illegal Substances are considered Third/Fourth Offenses.

Offense Consequences:

- First Offense Verbal Warning and Counselor Meeting
- Second Offense Written Notice and Parent/Guardian Notification
- Third Offense Dismissal (for the day) and Parent/Guardian Pick-up
- Fourth Offense Camper Suspension (for the remainder of summer without tuition reimbursement)

The above consequences are general guidelines and will be administered at the discretion of the administration.
